

Contextual Menus



- Contextual Menus are everywhere
- To find them, all you have to do is control click 
- Or if you have a 2 button mouse just right click 

- Depending on where you are you
- will get a pop up menu,
- this is a keynote contextual menu



You will get different contextual menus depending on where you control click or right click with your mouse

For example, control clicking on a blank spot on the desktop




In Finder windows the Action Button will many times do the same things as the contextual menu, and more.


Example

Click on the Folder Actions Setup




And you get a pop up that lets you select a folder action






When you are in an application contextual menus really shine

In Mail.app the contextual menu



Control/right click on a misspelled word





And up pops a menu showing possible spelling, allowing you to correct the misspelled word or look it up among other choices
